- Guest speaker: Chuck Cantrell on the reactivation of the Gardner Community Center
  - S+NI: stakeholders and n'hd initiatives: working to get City to reopen the Gardner Com. Cntr.
  - Had mtg w/ Jon Cicerilli and Nanci Klein. City plan: use money from Google to pay staff to reopen for 2 years; but then what? non-starter w/ community.
  - Community working w/ City Staff on 4 points: programs; budget; access & activation; and planning for an event to reopen Center in June 2024.
  - Push for June: (1) be part of this year's budget cycle, and (2) show community able to activate the Center.
  - Center now is generally closed. Is used for senior food nutrition distribution a County-funded program.
  - Google money wasn't for paying City salaries: City needs to do its share: money should be for expanding services and assuring community access to them.
  - discussion on reuse of centers; City leases out the centers to keep them occupied, to deter squatters & damage. Also, aquatic program and swimming pools: program cut during Great Recession.

- Park funding, High-rise tax incentives, Mayor's proposal for commercialization of city parks:
  "Joint Letter"<sup>2</sup> from advocates re: Mayor's Budget Letter and retail & commercial use of parkland, 3/16/24; and LLA public comment<sup>3</sup> 3/19/24
- Mayor directed City Mngr to do polling to change City Charter to allow companies to take over parks to help pay for maintenance.
- Push is coming from group that wants to take over Plaza de Cesar Chavez: restaurants, amphitheater? J.Paul contributed \$500k for refurbishment in advance of Nvidia convention.
- Conservancies not necessarily bad, but many fail. Bryant Park in NYC is a special case: pay to enter; nearby apartments pay \$100/yr towards maintenance.
- There is public interest in coffee carts. night markets to display & sell artworks, etc.: "activate" the parks but that wouldn't solve the half-billion-dollar backlog.
- Community Centers could be 'reused" because they're short-term (3 yr) leases but to build a restaurant, will want much longer lease.
- Didn't have time to bring to D6NLG: only ~48 hrs from Mayor's statement to get letter to Council.
- Also: Stormwater Permit: We've talked about Green Stormwater Infrastructure (GSI) to clean run-off; now also have to move encampments 500 ft away from streams. Estimate: \$24M to provide needed emergency housing − on top of prior \$27M budget shortfall → something like \$55 to \$60M budget cuts this fiscal year, with major cuts to Transportation and to Parks & Rec Dept.
- Mayor's office asking Off. of Econ. Dev'lpmnt (OED) to consider continuing/extending discounts ("incentives"), and maybe cancelling Construction & Conveyance (C&C) taxes on downtown highrises. High interest rates are making new construction infeasible, but City thinks giving away park fees will make a difference.
- On a recent project downtown, apartments cost ~\$1M each to build, and park fees were \$500 very small component.
- National problem: nobody can get financing; rent growth is too low; downtowns don't have enough workers. City wants to feel that it's doing something.
  - >> D6NLG action? Our letter on definition of Chartered Parks: wait for when it's agendized.
