LLA talk, Item 8.2, high-rise discounts. [6/18/24]

Hi, I'm Larry Ames, speaking on behalf of the San José Parks & Rec Commission.

As we said in our letter, we ask you to **reject** both point **(c)** – the discount to the Downtown high-rise Park Fee, and point **(d)** – to study extending the discount program beyond Downtown and to low- and mid-rise housing.

Housing and Parks are **both** important parts of the city. We **can't** have a city without housing, but also we **won't** have a thriving and attractive city without quality parks.

The way to *encourage* downtown residential development is to make downtown living *more attractive* – with quality nearby parks!

The city's park fees are *minor* compared to the developer's high cost of land, materials, and the cost of borrowed money, but the park fees are *critical* for the city's parks – providing a major portion of the funds that *build* and *maintain* our parks.

In many parts of the city, often the *only* way a park can be *repaired* or *enhanced* is if there's nearby development that will provide park fees.

The more the park fees are *discounted*, the more our parks are *diminished*.

Keep San José an attractive and vibrant city by supporting our parks!
